## Dedicate the Temple,

(A)—The Chaplain reads Psalm 72, verse 16.

(B)—Before the First Circuit the Brethren sing:—

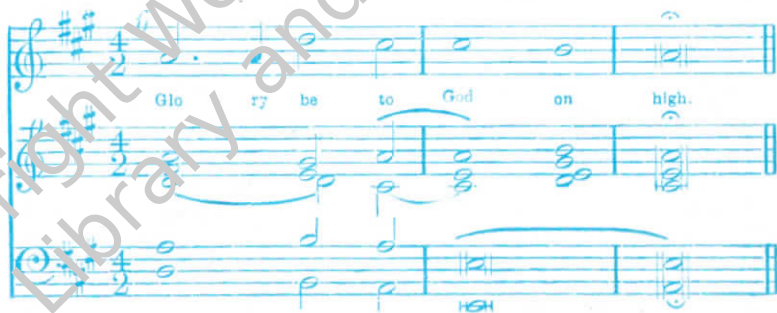
