Instructions.

ROBING :

All Knights, with the exception of the Provincial Prelates, will robe in the adjoining Lyttelton Schools, entrance in the Priory Churchyard.

The Provincial Prelates will robe in the Clergy Vestry, and it is hoped they will wear Copes.

ADMISSION :

Ladies and Friends of the Knights will be admitted to the Nave, by the North Door, on presentation of Ticket of Admission, which may be obtained from the Provincial Marshal.

At 3-0 p.m.

The Great Officers, Present and Past, with the Prov. Sub Prior, will enter the Priory, by the North Door, in procession, previous to which all other Knights must be seated in their places as directed by the Provincial Marshal.

At 3-15 p.m.

The Provincial Prelates with the Clergy and Choir will enter in procession.

During the singing of the Opening Hymn the Provincial Prior will enter escorted by his Constables and the Sword, Standard, and Banner Bearers.

SEATING

Will be reserved in the Nave for all Knights in the habit of the Order who have intimated their intention to be present to the Provincial Marshal, not later than Tuesday, May 23rd, 1938.

The attendance of Ladies and Friends will be welcomed, and they will be seated in the Nave, in the rear of the Knights, and must take their seats in the Priory before 2-50 p.m., entering by the North Door.

ALMS

The Alms collected will be donated to the Priory Expenses Fund and the Hospital of St. John at Jerusalem.

TEA :

Tea, price 1/3 per head, will be provided at the Winter Gardens, after the Service, for those Knights and their Friends who have replied on the enclosed Postcard to the Provincial Marshal, Em. Kt. S. E. James, 36, Havelock Road, Handsworth, before May 23rd, 1938.
