The M.P.S.G. Commander gives Declaration of Constitution.

Music:—Short Voluntary on Organ.

The Grand Treasurer General passes round the Chapter sprinkling Corn.

Chant:—“May the Almighty giver of all good things shower down upon it His best blessing.”

The Grand Chancellor passes round the Chapter pouring out Wine.

Chant:—“May the Almighty give us thankful hearts and grant that we may be ever ready to relieve the wants of others.”

The Grand Secretary General passes round the Chapter pouring out Oil.
Chant:—"May He, whose Name is Love, grant that the Brethren meeting in this Chapter be ever of one heart and one mind, and may they always do unto others as they would it should be done unto them."

The Grand Chaplain passes round the Chapter with the Censer of Incense.

The Altar is lighted.

Music—Voluntary, by Organist.

Roses are sprinkled.

The M.P.S.G. Commander gives Consecration and Dedication Address.

The Stone is opened.

Anthem, or short Voluntary on Organ.

The Grand Marshal proclaims that the Chapter has been Consecrated.

Fanfare on Organ, or flourish of Trumpets.

5. At Five o'clock the Supreme Council 33^o to INSTALL the M.W.S. Designate, Illustrious Brother Samuel Steads Partridge, 30^o P.P.S.G.W., Prov. G. Secretary, Leicestershire and Rutland.
6. To Elect the Treasurer to the Chapter.
7. To Elect an Equerry for the Chapter.
8. The M.W.S. to Invest the Officers for the ensuing year.
9. To appoint a Committee to frame By-laws for the Chapter.
10. The Treasurer to receive the Annual Subscription, due in advance (viz., 3/6, to include the cost of three Banquets.).
11. To receive regularly made nominations for future Perfection.
12. To transact any further business that may arise either for the benefit of this Chapter or the advancement of the Order.
13. To close the Chapter in ancient form.

NOTICE.

Candidates for Perfection (who must have been M. Masons for at least one year) must appear with their Master Mason's Certificate, and in Craft (or Royal Arch) Clothing, with any Jewels but those of the Knight Templars, and duly provided with the Apron, Sword, Collar, and Jewel of the 18th degree.

At 6-30 p.m. or as soon as the Chapter is closed, a COMMEMORATION BANQUET will take place in the Hall under the presidency of the M.W.S., a ticket for which (to include Wine and Dessert) every member of the Chapter may obtain from the Recorder; and every visiting member of the A. & A. Rite, receiving a copy of this Summons, and *who has previous to the 25th instant, signified to the Recorder his intention to be present*, is also hereby cordially invited.
