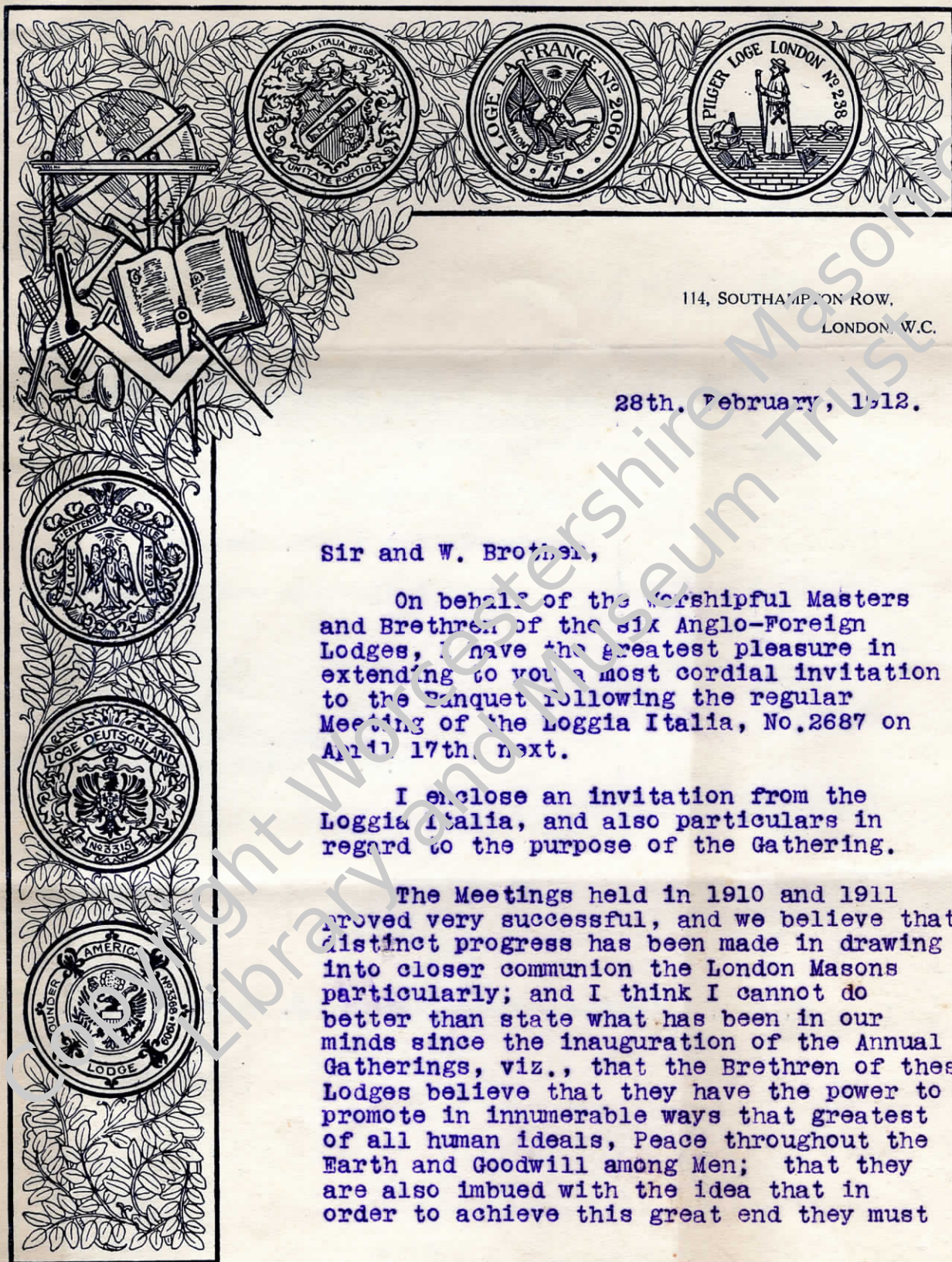


join forces, for although as individuals they can do much, still, by collective action they can do more.
