The Grand Chaplain passes round the Chapter with the Censer of Incense.

The Altar is lighted.

Music-Voluntary, by Organist.

Roses are sprinkled.

The M.P.S.G. Commander gives Consecration and Dedication Address.

The Stone is opened.

Anthem, or short Voluntary on Organ.

The Grand Marshal proclaims that the Chapter has been Consecrated. Fanfare on Organ, or flourish of Trumpets.

- 8. The M.W.S. to Invest the Officers for the ensuing year.
- 9. To appoint a Committee to frame By-laws for the Chapter.
- 10. The Treasurer to receive the Annual Subscription, due in adv. nce (iz., 31/6, w include the cost of three Banquets.)
- 11. To receive regularly made nominations for future Perfection.
- 12. To transact any further business that may arise, other for the beauti of this Chapter or the advancement of the Order.
- 13. To close the Chapter in ancient form.
