## The SOLS.

The forty jades on which they were mounted, regardless of the load of harmony upon their backs, were some of them restive, and others obstinate. The grand standard bearer, or rather the man who carried the pole, on which the sun was placed, was equally unpleasant and awkwardly situated; for instead of being able to display that glorious symbol of the fraternity on high, it was frequently set in the dust. In short the whole procession formed a scene equally grotesque and entertaining. Among the company in the coaches we could discern Mr. Byrg. Mr. Brook Watson, and other respectable characters, who, after the procession was finished, crowned the day with an elegant dinner, and its concomitant festivities, at Florida Gardens!
