- 1. The Consecrating Officer, having entered in procession with the Officers of Grand Lodge and Provincial Grand Lodge, takes the Chair and appoints his Officers.

And in all time and circumstance
Unite in brotherhood and love.

O bless the Brethren here this night, That more and more their lives may be Made glorious by increasing light, Acknowledged and derived from Thee.

- 3. The Lodge is opened in the Degree of Mark Master Mason.
- 4. The Consecrating Officer addresses the Brethren on the object of the Meeting, and cills upon the Chaplain to give the

- 6. The Director of Ceremonies addresses the Consecrating Office.

 The Consecrating Officer replies and gives direction.
- 7. The Petitioners are arranged in order in the East
- 8. The Warrant is read by the Provincial Grand Secretary.

The Consecrating Officer enquires of the Brethren if they approve of the Officers named in the Warrant.

The Petitioners signify their approval in Masonic Form and resume their seats.

The Consecrating Officer scatters Corn—the emblem of Abundance and Plenty. *Musical Response*—Glory be to God on High.

16. Before the Second Circuit the Chaplain reads Nehemiah, chap. x., verse 39.

The Brethren sing-

Where there a shrine to Him alone They built, with worship, sin to foil, On threshold and on Corner-stone They poured out Corn, and Wine, and Oil.

The Consecrating Officer pours Wine—the emblem of Joy and Gladness.

Musical Response—Glory be to God on High.

17. Before the Third Circuit the Chaplain reads Exodus, chap. xxx, verses 25 and 26.

The Brethren sing-

And we have come, fraternal bands,
With joy and pride and prosperous spoil,
To honour Him by votive hands,
With streams of Corn, and Wine, and Oil.

The Consecrating Officer sprinkles Oil—the emblem of Peace and Pernony. *Musical Response*—Glory be to God on High.

- 18. The Petitioners are arranged round the Lodge Board facing outwards, where they remain until after the Dedication.
- 19. Before the Fourth Circuit the Chaplain reads Leviticus, chap. ii., erse 13.

The Consecrating Officer strews Salt—the empiem of Fidelity, Hospitality and Everlasting Friendship.
