## AUGUSTUS FREDERICK GODSON

The name of this Lodge is derived from Augustus Frederick Godson, who, at the time of its consecration, was D.P.G.M.M. for Warwickshire.

Sir A. F. Godson was the eldest son of Mr. S. H. Godson of Court House, Tenbury, and was born on August 12th, 1835. He was educated at St. Peter's School, London; King's College, London and Queen's College, Oxford, he took his M.A. Degree in 1859 and was called to the Bar in the same year.

Sir Frederick was elected M.P. for Kidderminster in 1886 and retained the seat for twenty years, when failing health compelled him to relinquish his part in Parliament.

He was a Justice of the Peace and an active member of Quarter Sessions and in addition took a very great interest in works of philanthropy, the Worcestershire Society, the Herefordshire Society and many other movements which were forwarded very materially by his personal and practical interest. He was a Loriner and a member of the Patternmakers' Company, London.

In the Worcester Journal of March 12th, 1898 is an account of a meeting at Kidderminster Masonic Hall when Wor. Bro. Godson was presented with his portrait, painted by Mr. Herbert A. Oliver in recognition of his distinguished services to the Province. Wor. Bro. Colonel Warner Ottley, D.P.G.M. presided, and, in making the presentation, was supported by many representatives of each Masonic body in the Province. The frontispiece to this booklet was taken from this portrait.

Wor. Bro. Godson was knighted in 1898. He lived honoured and respected and died regretted at the age of 71, on October 11th, 1906.

The Petition for the formation of THE GODSON LODGE OF MARK MASTER MASONS was presented on December 18th. 1883, and the Warrant signed by Lord Henker, M.W. Grand Mark Master, was dated January 1st. 1884, and fixes the days of Meeting as the 3rd. Monday in February, May, August and November.

The Lodge was consecrated at Kidderminster Masonic Hall, on Monday, February 18th. 1884, at 2 o'clock p.m. by:—

The ballot proved in their favour and with the exception of Bro. W. J. Turney, who was absent, they were advanced to the degree of M.M.M. There is no further record in the minute books with regard to Bro. Turney.

Following the Consecration, Bro. Geo. Taylor was installed first Worshipful Master of the Godson Lodge of Mark Master Masons by V. Wor. Bro. Fredk. Binckes, Grand Mark Secretary.

There is no reference to S. & J. Overseers in the first list, the titles of 1st. and 2nd Overseers being used.

It is also interesting to note that nine of the brethren advanced were invested as Officers the same day, viz.:—2nd. Overseer, S. & J. Deacons, Secretary, Inner Guard, R. of Marks, Director of Ceremonies and two Stewards.

Two other items of interest marked the Consecration ceremony:—

- 1st. The Consecrating Officers were elected Honorary Members of the Lodge.
- 2nd. Bro. Godson, by a gift of ten guineas, qualified the W.M.'s chair as a Life Subscriber to the Mark Benevolent Fund.



The first minutes conclude with the following words :—

“ The whole of those present adjourned to the Banquet served in the Dining Hall where the afterproceedings terminated in a manner worthy of the occasion, and to the gratification of all concerned.”

On Monday, 19th. of May, 1884, the meeting following the Consecration, Bro. Barkley, P.M. 59, advanced Bro. Dugard (M.M. of Hope and Charity Lodge, No. 377 and Lehmere Lodge, No. 1874) as Tyler and Bro. W. M. Roden was elected the first Treasurer of the Lodge at this meeting, the first list of Officers being thus completed.

Until the end of the year 1890 the Lodge met regularly as authorised by the Warrant on the third Monday in February, May, August and November at Kidderminster Masonic Hall, with the exception of May, 1885, when there is no record in the Minute Book of a meeting. A page has been cut from the book at this point and it is doubtful whether any importance is to be attached to this fact or not. The minutes of February 16th. 1885 were signed as confirmed on August 17th. 1885, although there is no record in the minutes of the latter date of such confirmation. From this date, however, it is gratifying to note that the record is quite unbroken.

For a period of over three years, following November, 1885 no new candidates offered themselves for advancement and the attendances generally were very small. On May 25th. 1888 it was suggested by V. Wor. Bro. Geo. Taylor, then Deputy Provincial Grand Mark Master for Worcestershire, that the Lodge be made movable and that some of the meetings be held in Dudley; but it was not until May 19th. 1890 that a definite move was made in that direction, when on the proposition of Wor. Bro. Abraham Green, P.M. it was resolved “ That the next meeting of this Lodge be held at The Saracen’s Head Hotel, Dudley, and that a Dispensation be obtained for that purpose.”

The experiment of meeting at Dudley met with instant success. This notable date was Monday, August 18th. 1890 when the following met at the Saracen's Head Hotel :—

The last named, a member of Bedford Mark Lodge, Warwickshire, became a joining member and was elected Secretary of the Lodge.

they were unanimously elected.

Two further minutes of this meeting read as follows:—

“ Brothers Walker, Smith, Park (sic), Jones and Chambers being present and having signed the usual declarations, were advanced to the honourable degree of Mark Master Masons, the ceremony being performed by the Worshipful Master and the Charge was delivered to them in a most impressive manner by Wor. Bro. A. Green, P.M.

“Proposed by Bro. A. Green and seconded by the Worshipful Master that the thanks of this Lodge be given to the W.M. and Brethren of Harmonic Lodge, No. 252, for the use of their Lodge Room on this occasion, being the first time on which the degree of Mark Masonry was performed and held in Dudley.”

It is important to note that two of the above Brethren, Bros. E. J. Chambers and James Jones, ultimately received the honours of appointment as Deputy Grand Masters of Provincial Grand Mark Lodge of Worcestershire.

Since this memorable date, August 18th, 1890, the Lodge has met at Kidderminster on four occasions only, viz. :— November, 1890, May and November, 1891 and August, 1892. All other meetings have been held at the Saracen's Head Hotel, Dudley, which, since November, 1907, is referred to as The Freemasons' Tavern.

On November 23rd, 1897, it was resolved that the number of Meetings be increased to six per annum. This was carried out during the following year, 1898, only, four again being adopted and retained up to the present time with no further variations excepting slight alterations in the dates.

The total number of regular meetings held during the fifty years is twenty-nine at Kidderminster and 172 at Dudley. There have also been held nine emergency meetings, eight of which were held in Dudley.

# THE GODSON LODGE OF M.M.M.

AND

## Provincial Grand Mark Lodge of Worcestershire

At a meeting of this Lodge held on Monday, 18th. of August, 1884, the following minute was recorded:—

“In the absence of Wor. Bro. W. C. Green, S.W. the Secretary, Bro. G. R. Green, proposed that The Grand Mark Master, Earl of Kintore, be solicited that he will under Regulation No. 54 of the Constitution of Grand Mark Lodge grant a Provincial Grand Mark Lodge for the Province of Worcestershire, the said Province having now two successful Mark Lodges. And this Lodge further recommend that W.D.P.G.M., Bro. A. F. Godson, be the first Provincial Grand Mark Master.

The motion on being put from the chair was carried unanimously and ordered to be entered in the minutes.”

There is no further reference to this resolution in the minutes of subsequent meetings, but it is evident that the petition was acceded to by the fact that a Provincial Grand Mark Lodge was constituted and held its first meeting under the Banner of Lechmere Lodge of Mark Master Masons, No. 59, at Worcester, on December 8th. 1884. Wor. Bro. A. F. Godson was installed as the first Provincial Grand Mark Master of Worcestershire and continued in that office until his death in 1906. He was succeeded by R. Wor. Bro. Rt. Hon. Lord Athlumney who was installed Provincial Grand Mark Master on April 19th. 1907.

## THE LODGE OF INSTRUCTION.

On Monday, November 19th. 1888, the J.W., Bro. T. F. Bland, suggested "That a Lodge of Instruction be held on the Thursday before the 3rd. Monday in February." The W.M., Wor. Bro. H. B. Pigot, instructed the Secretary to call such meeting. At the next meeting the Secretary stated "That he had summoned a Lodge of Instruction but very few brethren attending it was not thought necessary to attempt the work."

This matter was next brought forward on February 19th. 1894, when Bro. J. W. Roberts proposed and Bro. M. Smith seconded "That a Lodge of Instruction be formed in connection with the Godson Lodge of Mark Master Masons, the preliminary details of which be arranged at a meeting of the members of the Lodge to be held at the close of this evening's banquet." The following statement follows the minutes of the last mentioned meeting:—

"The meeting to discuss the preliminary arrangements of the Lodge of Instruction was held after Banquet when, Very Wor. Bro. A. Greer, D.P.G.M.M. took the chair, Bro. T. H. Edwards was appointed Secretary and the minutes of the meeting will be found duly entered in his minute book."

On April 16th. 1894 Bro. Edwards, Secretary of the Lodge of Instruction reported that the Bye-laws framed for that Lodge had been sanctioned by the Prov. Grand Master and the same were ordered to be distributed among the brethren. The minutes appear to be lost, but it is very doubtful whether the meetings were continued after 1895. The minutes were read at the regular Lodge meetings until November, 1895, after which there is no further record until 1905.



The first meeting of the Lodge of Instruction recorded in the existing minute book is Nov. 21st., 1905, when a resolution was passed "That the Lodge of Instruction in connection with the Godson Lodge of M.M.M. No. 330 be **revived,**" with Wor. Bro. J. W. Roberts as Preceptor. Eight meetings were held in 1906, six in 1907 and two in 1908 when they apparently ceased again, there being no further minutes until 1924.

On November 14th. 1924 the Lodge of Instruction was again brought into existence when the D.P.G.M. Wor. Bro. James Jones presided over a meeting at which twenty-two were present and enrolled as members. The Lodge thus formed met regularly four times per annum until September, 1929 when the Bye-laws were altered to allow of eight meetings per annum. Since then the Lodge has met regularly up to the present time.
