That your Petitioners are very sensible of the Honour done to us  
here by your Deputation & for as much as we are a sufficient  
Number of Brothers regularly & by made soci<sup>s</sup> in His Majestys  
Kingdoms of Great Britain & Ireland as any in you on  
Examination & are now desirous of Enjoying each other (as well)  
as those made here of this respective Nation & events annexed  
as Masons in a Reg<sup>r</sup> or constituted Lodge for our Harmony  
& Union together as we are our Brethren & may at any time  
arrive here or such as we made to a reas<sup>r</sup> if it so to say in  
due manner & to m<sup>r</sup> Therefor. We request as well in our  
Own Name and Names As v<sup>r</sup> o<sup>r</sup> A other Brother it may for  
eare of you will it be to give necessary orders to all our  
Brother in this place to give their due Attention  
and on all a reasonable hour to assist you & the rest of  
the Br<sup>r</sup> th<sup>r</sup> or in their societys towards constituting a  
Lodge or Lodge at the sign of the Branch of Grapes in Dring<sup>r</sup>  
Street London by the same of yr house of Mr. Edward Lutwyche  
Monday the 30<sup>r</sup> Inst. whereby we may be enabled to assist  
one in other in due & lawfull Works of Ancient Masonry  
or at any other place or Places as may seem more meet &  
Requisite to our G<sup>r</sup> M<sup>r</sup> his Deputys & of rest of the Bro. may  
agree upon & then & there to make such private laws & rules  
not contrarie to the bounds prescribed to us in our Constituted Lodge  
of restrictions or of Deputation & as will be approved  
by them according to Antient Right of custom  
& the lodges to be held on Every second & fourth Wednesday  
in each Month for a common good of us & Brethren & others  
convenience herein ther doubt not will repeat itself  
the honour of Masonry by enlarging it w<sup>r</sup> many  
Worthy Gentlemen in this Town & elsewhere residing  
an w<sup>r</sup> respect Sir

A Special Chapter

Free & Accepted Masons

Regularly met & congregated at the house of  
Edw Lutwyche at the Sign of the Burnt Offerings  
in King's Street BOSTON N ENGL. On Monday  
July the 30<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1733. L. 5733.

The following Brethren being regularly  
met in the Lodge at y<sup>e</sup> house aforesaid indubitably  
agreed to petition, & did then accordingly petition  
Our R<sup>t</sup> W<sup>r</sup>sp<sup>r</sup>: Bro. G<sup>r</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Trinity R<sup>t</sup> Provincial  
Grand Master of the Free & Accepted Masons  
of New England, to constitute us in a regular  
Lodge by the name of y<sup>e</sup> New & Authorit<sup>y</sup> to him  
given by: Deputation from Our R<sup>t</sup> W<sup>r</sup>sp<sup>r</sup> full  
W<sup>r</sup>sp<sup>r</sup> Brother and R<sup>t</sup> Hon<sup>r</sup> Anthony  
Love Viscomte Contaque Grand Master  
of England Dated in London the 13<sup>th</sup> day  
of April A.D. 1733 And of Masonry A. 5733  
And sealed with y<sup>e</sup> Seal of the Grand Lodge  
Signed by Our R<sup>t</sup> W<sup>r</sup>sp<sup>r</sup> Brothers  
George Pook Esq<sup>r</sup> Q. W. of England  
James Moor Smith Esq<sup>r</sup> Q. W. of England.

OPPOSITE . . . a facsimile reproduction in actual size of the Boston Gazette, published the day St. John's Lodge held its first meeting. This is the only issue for the year 1733 in the files of the Boston Public Library.

It is assumed that the first meeting of St. John's Lodge was chronicled in the following week's edition, no copy of which is now in existence, to the best of our knowledge. Note the reference to "the Bunch of Grapes" tavern in the right hand column of the last page, ten lines from the top.
