REPORT.



THE M.W. BROTHER THE
MARQUESS OF HERTFORD,
RIGHT WORSHIPFUL PROVINCIAL GRAND MASTER.

ON the 19th of May last the Most Hon. the Marquess of Hertford, Lord Lieutenant of the County, completed 25 years as Right Wor. Provincial Grand Master of the Mark Degree of Freemasonry in Warwickshire.

The Brethren of the Mark Degree had been looking forward to the auspicious event with considerable pleasure, and under the able guidance of the Deputy Provincial Grand Master (Wor. Bro. Wright Wilson) and the energetic co-operation of the Provincial Grand Secretary (Wor. Bro. Charlie D. Eaton), with the assistance of a Committee of Representatives of the Mark Lodges, special preparation was made to celebrate the occasion in a memorable manner. A subscription list was opened for the purchase of a piece of Plate suitably engraved, and it was the intention of Wor. Bro. Wright Wilson and Mrs. Wilson to invite the Brethren with their Ladies to a Garden Party at "Cottesbrook," Acocks Green, where the presentation could be made amongst charming surroundings.

Unfortunately owing to the illness of the Marquess, this arrangement had to be abandoned, and, as the matter was deemed urgent, a meeting of the Committee was held on the 18th May, a congratulatory letter drawn up, engrossed on Vellum and signed by all those present, and despatched so as to greet his Lordship on the anniversary of his becoming the Head of the Province (May 19th). The purchase of a massive silver Rose Bowl, engraved with his Lordship's Crest and the Emblem of the Provincial Grand Lodge, was decided upon, and a deputation, consisting of the Deputy Provincial Grand Master, the two Wardens of the Province (Wor. Bro. J. Headon Boocock and Wor. Bro. F. J. Penn), and the Provincial Grand Secretary, was

appointed to make the presentation, which, at the request of Lord Hertford, was done privately at Ragley, on May 26th, in the presence of the members of his family. The Marquess greatly admired the Rose Bowl, which was considered by himself and family a very charming specimen of Messrs. Elkington's art. His Lordship evidently keenly appreciated the handsome presentation and the good wishes of the Brethren. He remarked that he should greatly prize this very handsome present as a token of their regard. It was a matter of very sincere gratification to him that in Warwickshire the Mark Degree had so greatly prospered, and he had been particularly pleased that during the last two years he had been privileged to consecrate two new Lodges in the Province—one at Coventry, the "Seymour" Mark Masters Lodge, and the "Temperance" Mark Masters Lodge, in the City of Birmingham.

Herewith is appended a Photograph of the Rose Bowl, the terms of the Address, and a copy of the very appreciative letter since received from the Right Worshipful Provincial Grand Master by the Deputy, issued at his Lordship's special request.
