

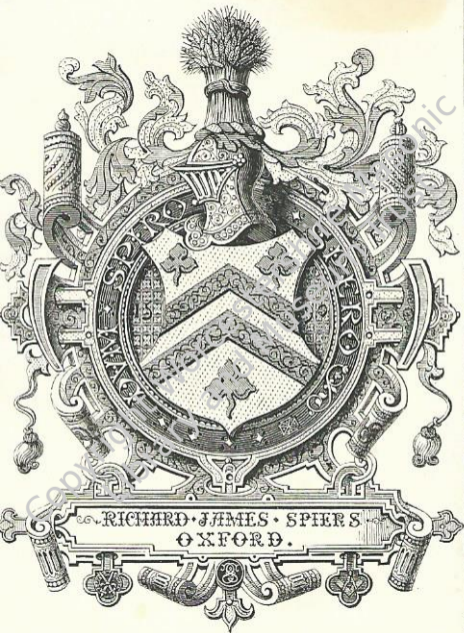
The first Prov. G. M. recorded was  
Sir R. Cornwall in 1752. His  
jurisdiction comprised not only W. with  
Hereford, but Gloucestershire, Salop  
& Monmouth - In 1792. Bro John  
Dent a member of Child. Co. M.P.  
in Gloucester & after for Ayles held  
office till 1825, (no record of holding  
Lodge) - After his death efforts  
were made in vain to secure a Bro  
of position, & the Prov. G. Registrar  
appointed W<sup>o</sup> Roden of Midd. G. M.  
G. M. till 1837. When Bro W. C. Scam  
came amongst the held office  
till 1866 -

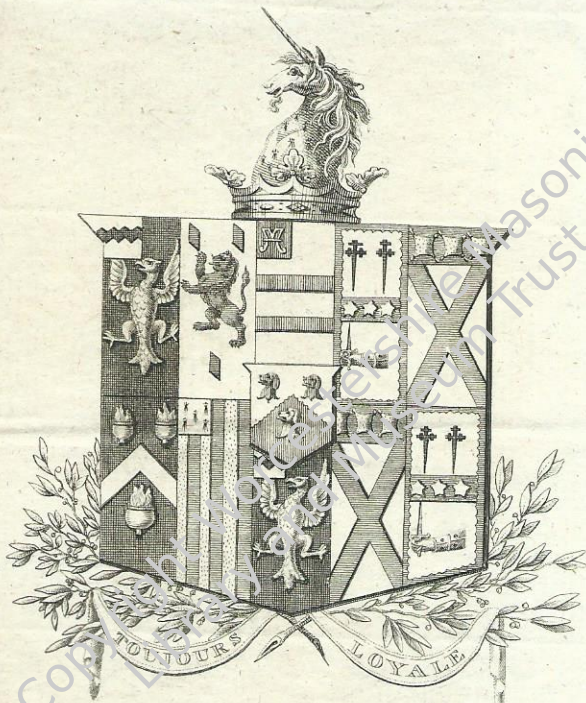
