

Richard de Vernon Preceptory No: 52 Stationed at Dudley

1950 - 2000

As we celebrate the Millennium 2000, it offers an opportunity to look back fifty years, when Eminent Knight J. A. Nayler was Eminent Preceptor and Installed Companion William Elev Homer into the Preceptory in September 1950. As a young man the writer recalls sitting in Mr Nayler's office, representing Top Church ("St Thomas' Church") Dudley, prior to 1950 and thinking "What a wonderful fellow, I would love to emulate him". The Registrar was Eminent Knight Harry Cherrington, a local accountant, followed in 1951 by Eminent Knight Y. Iliam H. Turner, a local solicitor. The Treasurer was the Borough Engineer, Eminent Knight J. S. Evans and the Equerry was Companion Cooksey, the Verger at Netherton Church. The Light Eminent Knight F. T. Goodman was the Provincial Prior, who was Installed Eminen. The ceptor of Vichard de Vernon Preceptory No: 52, in February 1957, for the Centenary Celebrations. Most unfortunately, he received the Great Captain's Call five days befor this eighty first birthday, one month before the Centenary Celebration was due to take place.

It is quite interesting to look at the names of those who joined. R. S. Goodman, who was Registrar for the Centenary; J. E. (Johnnie) Rowe, who were Mead Serve, at Top Church ("St Thomas' Church") Dudley; Kenneth Buckler, for many years Organism of the Preceptory and organist at Netherton Church and later at St Edminie's Church. Dudley; Stanley Jennings of Netherton; George Armstrong from the Crown Ketal, who became Equerry in 1956, when Companion Cooksey received the Great Captain's Call; and Don Koden who became Equerry in 1957.

1955 saw that great and beloved Brother Knight Cyril Williams Allden become Eminent Preceptor. A local Bank Manager in Brierlev Hill, he had already been for many years the great Samaritan for the area. Over nany years he pressed for the Preceptory to have a Banner and for the names of members to be engraved in the Firing Swords (this had elapsed some years earlier).

Both these tasks were completed many years later. When Eminent Knight Bill Homer and the writer took the Banner to the Nursing Home for Very Eminent Knight Cyril to see it on the day it arrived from the makers, his eyes it up and he raised his hand in pleasure. He received the Great Captain's Call the near day. These matters are reported more fully later.

We now nove on to the period following the Centenary Celebrations, 1959 onwards. During the first ten years two nomes stand out - H. G. Heath and H. A. Nock, both of whom rendered great service not only to the Preceptory, but also to the Province. Two great names were produced in the Province at this time - the very loveable Provincial Prior, the Very Eminent Knight Dr Bunting of Hardwick Manor, Worcester, and his Sub Prior, the Very Eminent Knight Frederick Hickton Griffiths, who had previously served for fifteen years as Vice Chancellor of the Province. He continued to serve for five years as Sub Prior, followed by twenty two years as Provincial Prior, a total of forty two years Service to the Province.

Serving the Province from the Preceptory at the time were the Provincial Prelate, Eminent Knight the Rev. R. H. Fowler; the Provincial 2nd Constable, A. E. Hunt; the Provincial Deputy Marshal and Provincial Commander of the Bodyguard, J. A. Nayler; the Provincial Standard Bearer (VB), W. H. Turner; and two members of the Provincial Bodyguard, - Brother Knights Goodman and Pugh.

Over the next ten years many members were Installed who are still, or were recently serving and it now becomes difficult to highlight or not to mention names, but this has to be done. The first name in this period is Eminent Knight Dr. H. John White, our present Almoner; Eminent Knight W. H. Owen, who served for many years as Deputy Marshal; Eminent Knight C. G. Pagett, our present Marshal; Eminent Knights Dr. S. P. B. Way and J. N. Smith, who over the years have been very much involved in the work of the Preceptory. (J. N. Smith being for many years Chairman of the Board at Wellington Road and who also made and presented the stands and tables when the Preceptory decided to reintroduce its own Malta Ceremonies). At the and of the ten year period Eminent Knight M. B. Simpson, our present Chaplain, (following in the Masonic footsteps of his highly thought of Father, Worshipful Brother Birt Simpson); and Brother Knight A. G. Walker, who was Organist until a short time ago, were Installed into the Preceptory.

The next ten years, 1979 - 1989, could be said to be a bumper period with ho less than 13 candidates being Installed as members. The first being Eminent Knight A. J. R. Evans, who served as Eminent Preceptor for two years - 1989/90. Some who never went through the Chair of the Preceptory were - Brother Knights Harty; Galbraith (the Acquistrar Lesone the writer took over); Devonport; Dr. R. M. Jarratt; Bullas; Hipkiss (who went to New Zeeland); Dean; Eminent Knight Bowen (Past Eminent Preceptor of 421); and Eminent Knight Canon Cade, a joining member from Kent.

However, those who played a major part in the Pie ep tory and come in the Province, were Eminent Knight J. Ball; Eminent Knight Canar. Perkins, the present Provincial Vice Chancellor; Eminent Knight Finnis (who joined as from Mana); Eminent Knight Hayes, (recently the Registrar); Eminent Knights D. J. Jarratt; Ayling; and Angell; all of whom served both Preceptory and Province.

In 1991 we were privileged to have the 1990 Prest nian Lecturer to address the Preceptory. Eminent Knight Fredrick H. Sm/th was appointed Great Sword Bearer in 1979 and Past Great Herald in 1989 and Great Property in 1994, he was author of many books, more especially "Brethren in Chivalry 1751 - 1591".

The nineties, will probably be remember of for the amount of activity within the Preceptory and the involvement in the Province. The two leaders of the Province during this period, can without doubt be and to be an epitomy of excellence. The Right Eminent Knight Robert Whitlock and the Light Erabent Knight John Denton, helped to make the Province a force to be recognised. Both we ever supported by Provincial Sub Priors - John Denton to Robert Whitlock and Very Frain at Knights Woolley and Wright to John Denton. Eminent Knight Cedric Pagett was the Provincial Organist and he also presented the Preceptory with two very beautiful vases for the Altar.

1992 was an outstanding year, because on the 13th of February the Preceptory Banner was Dedicated. This marked the culmination of two years hard work by Eminent Knights Pagett and Bate, (the then *Eminent Preceptor*), in drawing up designs, considering costing, obtaining quotes and most of all obtaining the authority of Great Priory to proceed. At all times during this period the support of Right Eminent Knight Robert Whitlock was always forthcoming. The cost of the Banner was £822 50p and the Preceptory had adequate funds to cover this. However, a member (who requested anonymity) offered to cover the VAT. This was overheard by another member, who said he wished to contribute and as a result a fund was opened. By early February 1992, no less than £622.50p had been raised.

The Banner arrived a few days before the Dedication, as described earlier, and was taken for Very Eminent Knight Cyril Williams Allden to see. His son later telephoned the Registrar to say his father had left £200, to be made available to clear the cost of the Banner.


Because the cost of the Banner had been cleared by subscription, the Preceptory was now in a position to consider another of Very Eminent Knight Cyril Williams Allden wishes - to have the names of members engraved on the Firing Swords. This practice had been abandoned many years previously, due to lack of funds. Thanks to the efforts of Eminent Knights Pagett, Jarratt, and Angell, this now became possible and was achieved in a very short time.

Brother Knight Lucjon L. Finnis became *Eminent Preceptor* and he was followed in turn by Brother Knight Graham L. Perkins (the present *Provincial Vice Chancellor*); Brother Knight Peter J. Hayes; Brother Knight L. Peter Hughes; Brother Knight David J. Jarratt; and Brother Knight Richard A. Ayling.



The 12th of February 1998 saw Eminent Knight Granville Angell in the Preceptors Chair, when he not only exhibited (by kind permission of the Right Eminent Provincial Prior), his Banner as Lord of the Manor of Cannock, but also presented the Preceptory with a magnificent Crucifix. He had spent seven long years trying to locate and obtain a true Knight Templar Crucifix to present to the Preceptory, during his year in the Chair.

THE CROSS OF CALVAIO is erected on three steps which symbolize the Christian and Knight Templar virtues of Faith, Hope and Charity. Their without, too i sign ficant.

CARITIES the largest size and rests on the earth to inculcate the rity to our ellow men. HOPE rests on Charity and is jointed to LATH which attaches itself to the Cross - from which all depend.

THE PUCIFIX until the seventh century, no figure was represented on the Cross, but a lamb was sometime placed at its foot.

The first figures of our Lord were draped; when the undraped figure was introduced a Crown of Thorns was added. Until the Twelth Century the feet each had a nail, afterwards they were represented under one nail.

A KNIGHT TEMPLAR CRUCIFIX shows the head of Christ inclined towards his left shoulder.

In the past twelve years no less than eighteen members have been Installed into the Preceptory, including the 1999 Eminent Preceptor Arulampalan Salvaratnam, B.E.M. J.P. B.Sc., followed by the Millennium Eminent Preceptor Raymond Arthur Leadbeater, B.E.M.

We are honoured at this time in having no less than five members Provincially active Eminent Knights Graham Perkins, Past Deputy Great Sword Bearer, Provincial Vice Chancellor;
Eminent Knight Jim Bate, Provincial 2nd Constable; Eminent Knight Granville Angell,
Provincial Captain of the Guards; and two members of the Provincial Bodyguard Brother Knight
Tony Darlison and Brother Knight Ian Thorpe. Great Priory Officers at this time are:
Eminent Knight Dr. H. John White, JP., Past Great Herald,
Eminent Knight William H. Owen, Past Great Aide de Camp,
Eminent Knight Cedric G. Pagett, Past Great Herald,
Eminent Knight Paul A. Heynes, Past Great Chamberlain and
Eminent Knight Michael B. Simpson, Past Deputy Great Sword Bearer.

It is appropriate at this stage to conclude with a note, regarding the service of Emine. Kright William Eley Homer, MBE., whose outstanding service was recognised by the Most Eminent and Supreme Grand Master Leslie Felgate Dring, GCT., on the 17th of Way 2000 when he was appointed to the rank of Past Great Captain of Guards.

As an ending to this short continuation of the History of Kichard de Vernau Preceptory No: 52 and following on the active role of members in the Prevince of Warcestershire, it seems appropriate to acknowledge the support and involvement of the Right Aminent Provincial Prior, Right Eminent Knight John Denton, ably supposed by his Sub Prior the Very Eminent Knight Alan Granville Wright, T.D., J.P., Past Great Pegistrar, (who will be retiring after the Provincial Priory Meeting, to be held at Worcester, on Saturday the 28th of October 2000).

This however provides an opportunity of pay tribute has successor, Eminent Knight Leonard E. Goode, Past Great Herald, who not only provided the Preceptory with a most elegant picture frame for our Centenary Warrant but, also provided the photographs for the presentation and dedication of the Banner.
