"STABILITY" BACKGROUND

In 1813 two English Grand Lodges amalgaluated to iven. the present United Grand Lodge. On amalgamation each Grand Master appointed nine "worthies" plus two secretaries (total twenty) to form the Lodge of Reconciliation, which was entrusted with the duty of establishing and securing the "most perfect unity of obligation, of discipling working he lodges, of making, passing and raising, instructing and clothing Brothers." During 1814-15 eight brethren, including Philip Broadfoot, were appointed to fill vacancies The system as settled and taught by this Lodge of Reconcil ation was approved by United Grand Lodge at the Quarter!; Communication on 5th June, 1816. Its work completed, the longe of Rec nciliation was dissolved, but ten of its member, a alising the need of an authoritative teaching body, joined the Stability Lodge of Instruction (three of the ten, including Failin Broadfoo, being Founder members). "There may have been other reneral Lodges of Instruction working at that time, but if so they have left no record and have no present existence.

It is of interest to note that the Emulation Lodge of In provement came into being in 1823, and its figure-head, Peter Gilkes, joined in 1825. Unlike "Stability," which from its earliest tate in 1817 concentrated on the ritual and ceremonial as approved by Grand Lodge in 1816, Bro. Gilkes stated in 1830 that in the Emulation L. of I. he taught "only Lectures."
