Freemasonry in the Community

For nearly 300 years Freemasonry has been part of British Social and cultural life. Generations of Freemasons have played a full part in the history and development of their local communities and in national events.

In the community Freemasons have quietly provided care and support for the disadvantaged and those in distress.

Internally, a general charity fund was set up in 1725; a Girl's School was founded in 1788; a boys' charity in 1798; and an 'Asylum for the Aged' was opened in 1851. In the wider community The Royal College of Surgeons administers the income from Grand Lodges' 250th Anniversary Fund to fund medical research, financial support is given to the Hospice movement, the training of Macmillan Cancer Nurses for Children, to provide vehicles for the Red Cross and St. John's Ambulance and to a wide range of national and local Charities.

There is much in the principles, ideals, history and practices of Freemasonry of which Freemasons can be justifiably proud. Freemasonry in the Community Week is part of a wider programme of better informing the public as to what Freemasonry is and how it continues to play its part in community life.

Freemasonry is founded upon three Great Principles, which every member obligates himself to uphold:

Brotherly Love

Tolerance and respect for the opinions of others and behaving with kindness and understanding to all.

Relief

Caring not only for their own, but also for the community as a whole, both by charitable giving and by voluntary efforts and works as individuals.

Truth

Requiring high moral standards and aiming to achieve them in their own lives.



10. RELIEF CHEST SCHEME

Relief chest assets are in deposit and other bank balances, using the following criteria: protection of capital, enhanced returns and liquidity of capital deposits.

Tax repayments from covenants, gift aid and regular payment promises are included with donations to Relief Chests in the Statement of Financial Activities.

The directly attributable costs incurred by the Grand Charity in support of the scheme are ultimately borne by the unrestricted fund and thus are shown as a transfer between funds. The breakdown is shown in notes 5 and 6.

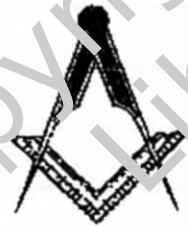
