## THE GRAND CHARITY - 1993 FESTIVAL

Since the announcement at Provincial Grand Lodge last year that the R.W. Provincial Grand Master would preside over the Festival for the Grand Charity in 1993, the brethren of the Province have been generous with their donations and covenants to their Lodge Benevolent Funds. All the working lodges, bar three, were visited by the Provincial Charity Stewards between December and April where <sup>were</sup> received with courtesy and not a little alarm when each lodge's target was realised (Lodge membership x £200). However, notwithstanding obligations previously entered into with the Provincial Grand Master's Charity Fund for Wiltshire, Charity Stewards are forwarding funds to the 1993 Festival Account where a very favourable interest rate is being obtained (currently 13.2%), which will be reflected in each lodge's total.

The Provincial Charity Stewards are most grateful to the R.W. Provincial Grand Master and the R.W. Grand Secretary for agreeing that lodge contributions to the Salisbury C.T. Scanner Appeal will be treated as contributions to the 1993 Festival.

At 30th June 1989 the 1993 Festival Account held by the Provincial Charity Stewards stood at £14,622-70. This figure does not include interest accrued nor the Salisbury Scanner contributions.

## REPORT OF THE PROVINCIAL GRAND REGISTRAR FOR THE YEAR 1988

Right Worshipful Provincial Grand Master, Officers and Brethren of Provincial Grand Lodge.

As Registrar of the Province, I have the honour to present my report for 1988, which is compiled from the figures and returns supplied to me by the Provincial Grand Secretary, to whom I express thanks for his assistance and help during the year.

Details of individual Lodge membership are printed overleaf and they will be published in due course in the Wiltshire Masonic Reference Book. At the beginning of the year the membership totalled 2817. During the year under review 92 Initiates and 68 Joining Members were welcomed into the Province - a total of 150 new members. Sadly, 59 of our members were called to the Grand Lodge above, 65 resigned and 15 (including 5 hon. members) were excluded - a loss of 139 members, giving a total membership at 31st December, 1988 of 2828 - an increase of 11 members.

The overall position in the Province of Wiltshire is sound and one can look forward to the future with confidence.
