
Provincial Grand Lodge of Worcestershire



ADDRESS OF THE PROVINCIAL GRAND MASTER PROVINCIAL GRAND LODGE SATURDAY, 22nd JUNE 2002

Thank you all for attending Provincial Grand Lodge this afternoon with my particular thanks to our distinguished visitors who regularly sacrifice their time to be with us. I will, as is our usual custom, introduce them to you all, but I ask you to reserve your approval and thanks until I have completed their introduction.

During the latter part of the year, the then Deputy
Provincial Grand Master, Robert Whitlock, intimated at 83 he
thought it was time to retire. I cannot think of any one mason who has made a more
substantial contribution to our Province, first as Provincial Grand Deputy
Provincial Grand Master in 1993. Not only has he been a figure head throughout the
Province, but he has spent two mornings a week in the provincial Office, which he
still continues to do. He has been both a friend and advisor to me and we shall all
miss him!

As a token of our entire respect I new have the greates pressure in presenting you with this cheque on behalf of the members of the Province.

Please spend it wisely, and save some for your celebration of 50 years in freemasonry on December 9th, when with the greatest pleasure I will resent you with your Certificate.

In his place I was able to appoint, and invest at Worcestershire Installed Masters Lodge in January, but Richard Coduard as Deputy Provincial Grand Master. He is well known to you an and need in words of mine to praise his dedication to Freemasonry and to the province of Worcestershire.

At the same Ceremony I Invested Bro Robert Vaughan as an Assistant Provincial Grand Master. He has been a great worker on our behalf, without ever seeking the list elight and he is already proving his worth.

I was pleased that they received their appropriate Ranks at the Annual Investiture at Grand Lodge in Anil, and I know you will all wish them well in the future.

I ikew e i must now thank our new Senior Assistant Provincial Grand Master, by Tony New Kard for his management of the most successful Training and Education Seminars and his willingness at all times to attend Lodges and functions on our behalf, and Bro Colin Brown, who as our Information Officer has been responsible for all the organisation of Freemasonry in the Community within our Province.

I must also thank the Provincial Secretary and his staff, and the Provincial Treasurer, Bro Stuart Edwards for keeping us on the straight and narrow.

This is my 10th report on the state of the Province, and I am pleased to say that we are in good heart, financially stable, administratively strong and without any

disciplinary proceedings for the 9th year in succession, and that our net loss in membership for last year was 30 brethren, a significant improvement on past years.

Whilst there is still room for us to improve on our membership, I am most pleased with the enthusiasm engendered by you all for Freemasonry in the Community.

We are now on the threshold of this national event and I hope it will be a blueprint for similar activities in the long term within the Province.

I would also mention the long standing friendship we have with our neighbouring Provinces, and that in common with Gloucestershire, Herefordships Shropshire and Monmouthshire we shall be celebrating 250 years of official recognition in 2003.

To celebrate this event, to be known as the Five Shires Annive sary celebration, we shall be jointly holding a dinner at the Metropole (Ac el on Fr' (a), 6th June 2003 at which wives and partners will be most welcome. It is hoped that the Grand Master will attend.

I have been invited to be President for the evening and I hape you will apport me, and our Province at the event.

Expect to hear more about this in the future.

Last year I encouraged you to support local charities that see dear to you, and nominated 3 charities, The New Samaritan Law, the Worceste shire County Air Ambulance and the Library and Museum Trust, and Lawker you to consider sending one charity box to each during the year. Thus has proved most satisfactory with donations of £5,700 to the New Mosonic Samaritan rund, £7,600 to the County Air Ambulance and £7,200 to the Laboury and Moveum Trust.

For the forthcoming year which renominate the New Samaritan Fund, of which a number of our brethren have no ceived trans dous assistance from during the year, the MacMillan Worcestershire prostrate of the Acorns Children's Hospice development at Worcester. I've ther information regarding these charities will be sent to your man'ty Steward wirly soon.

As far as the Library and Museum is concerned, and you know it is very important to me, and to usell, I am giving them permission under the Chairmanship of The Deputy Provincial Grand Master, and with my total support, to launch an erreal to coincid with the new season in September for the expansion of the further premises.

We have been bagging the issue to long, plugging holes as some of our most important artefacts deteriorate.

I judge the time has now come when I can ask you all to support a major appeal with the same enthusiasm that you gave to our recent Festival, only this time we shall be doing it for our own Province with some lasting bricks and mortar to remind us of the challenge.

Some two years ago I spoke to you about the Deputy Grand Master's report on Grand Ranks.

This had an adverse effect on our allocation.

His report has now been extended to Provincial Appointments, and is once again numerically based, rather than by the number of Lodges in any particular Province and that it should be merit-based and not the length of time served in our ORDER.

The formula is based upon one appointment for every 50 members, giving us a total of 75 first Appointments as against our normal 104, whilst promotions are restricted to 80% of first appointments giving us 60 as against our normal 120. As you might imagine this has caused me, and many other Provincial Grand Masters serious misgivings as it ends our traditional and well tried systems of awarding Provincial Ranks. This will be put to Grand Lodge in September, no doubt pass and then enshrined in the Book of Constitutions. It was due to be implemented and January 1st 2003.

If we have won anything by our representations, implementation has now the inpostponed until January 1st 2005 so that we may make transitional arrangements to comply with those changes more comfortably.

This, then, will be the last Provincial Grand Lodge held under our own disciplines. Next year we will have to go some way to acknowledge Grand Lodge's requirements. We shall be meeting shortly to consider the new criteria fo, advancement the Province and we will make our deliberations known to join the near nature, when I shall value any comments, particularly through Word stery hire Associated Masonic Lodges, to ensure a fairness that is acceptable to you all.

My thanks go to all those Acting Provincial Officers and provincial Representatives who either supported us by une's presence or independently visit Lodges and submit most valuable report; which of course will be of even more importance in the future.

And my thanks to those Officers a vointed and provided for their support during the forthcoming year and to the se

hard working brethren wis a try out the new soary arrangements that enable us to meet as a Provincial G. and Lodge in G eat Hall.

On a happy note I celebrated any 50 years in Freemasonry on December 5th last year in the poson of Lechmore Volunteer Lodge. Very kindly the Pro Grand Master, the Manguess of No than, ston visited us and presented me with my Certificate and a more happy and well organised occasion and I would like to pay tribute to my Lodge for giving me a wonderful. Christmas Party.

I would also like to thank many of you who wrote to me and for the kind thoughts transmitted to me from members of the Province.
