The St. Francis of Assisi Chapter was consecrated on 4th January, 1972.

Morley, C.B.E., T.D., D.L., 33°, Grand Chamberlain; M.III.Bro. Lt.Col. The Rev. G. R. Brocklebank, D.S.O., M.C., 33°, Grand Prior; M.III.Bro. R. A. Ingham Clark, 33°, Grand Secretary General; and officials to the Supreme Council, V.III.Bro. Dr. G. L. C. Colenso-Jones, 33°, Grand Director of Ceremonies, and Ill.Bro. W. L. Fearnchough, T.D., 32°, Deputy Grand Director of Ceremonies; Il of whom were elected Honorary Members together with V.III.Bro. Leonard W. Greenwood, M.A., 33°, Inspector General for Worcestershire.

There was a total of 70 Princes in attendance, including 40 visitors. The Alms amounted to £18.20.

The first regular meeting was neld on Saturday, 22nd January, 1972, without a Ceremony.

At the second meeting on 22nd April, ballot was held for Bro. Geoffrey Myatt and Bro. Francis Beach, and Bro. M. att. vas perfected and immediately appointed Organist of the Chapter.

At the next in eting on 22rd (e)tember, a ballot was taken for Bro. William Stephen Ellson who was perfected in January 1973. Bro. Richard Nicholas Hoare was perfected in September, 1973.

At the necking in April, 1974, ballots were held for Bro. Maurice Stanion and, as a joining member, E. & P. Pro. William A. B. Sherlock. Two years later in September, 1976, E. & P. Bro. J. Eric Cox was ent ironed as M.W.S. when 35 Princes were present. The Alms collected amounted to £13.10.

Over the 25 years the Chapter has held 76 regular meetings, perfected 53 candidates and has welcomed 436 visitors, averaging almost 6 per meeting. In all that time there has only been one meeting without a visitor.

Two founders of the Chapter went on to become Inspectors General in the Order, Donald S. Icke for Warwickshire and William D. S. Bennett for Worcestershire. Two members have served the Craft as Assistant Provincial Grand Masters, both in Warwickshire, again Donald Icke and Ill.Bro. Steve Ellson who continues in that capacity today. No less than ten of our members have served as acting Provincial Wardens in the Craft Province of Worcestershire.

We owe a great debt of gratitude to the founders of the Chapter for their enthusiasm and confidence for the future and we hope both those present today and those who have passed on feel proud of the foundation they laid 25 years ago.
