You have also been pleased, by Patent dated the 29th day of November, 1882, to appoint as Provincial Prior of New Zealand Sir Knight William Deamer, M.D., residing at Canterbury in that Colony, and the Preceptor of the Royal Canterbury Preceptory.

Your Council recommends that the following Grants be made from the Benevolent Fund to the undermentioned Sir Knights, viz.:—Thomas Sampson, £20; William Samuel Wallace, £30; and to Capt. L. R. C. Drouét, £5.

The Cœur de Lion Preceptory, Oxford, having represented that
