HOW TO BECOME A PROFICIENT MASON

The Modern Mason is not content merely to know the ritual; he wants to UNDERSTAND THE MEANING OF OUR CEREMONIES and something about the history of Freemasonry. His trouble, however, is to know WHAT BOOKS to read and in what order. We have had so many requests for guidance on this point that we have drawn up two schedules; the first is primarily intended for the man who has not been a Mason for more than two or three years; and many of the books should be given to him as he takes the degrees. The other is a slightly more advanced course for older Masons, and will be particularly useful to Preceptors of Lodges of Instruction, Past Masters and Secretaries of Lodges, and to all who are approaching or have passed the Chair. From it they can draw all manner of useful information on which they can base the numerous speeches which often constitute the bane of a keen Mason's career. Once he has studied this second course he need never be at a loss for an interesting theme for a speech, while those who desire to give lectures will find both in this and in the earlier course abundant material.

We cannot too strongly urge both the young Mason and the Past Master to study carefully each of these courses, which we are sure will bring an added interest into their Masonic careers.

THE MASONIC HANDBOOK SERIES

This book will come as a revelation to many who can no longer be called young Masons, for outside London few Masons realise the number and interest of the additional Degrees which await those who desire to go further in the Masonic quest. Not only the Mark and the Royal Arch are described, but every degree now working in Great Britain.

6. MORAL TEACHINGS OF FREEMASONRY. 6/6 net. Post 6d.

We have all heard that Freemasonry is a peculiar system of morality, etc., and it is certainly a very fine one. So this book deals with those fundamental moral teachings of the Craft which have made it universally respected.
