You dear Ribbons in person how truly thankful I am  
for your goodness and attention to your old friend

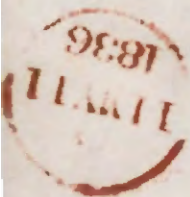

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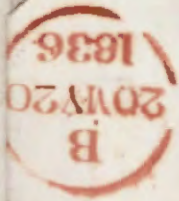
