

Weymouth 12<sup>th</sup> May 1838

Dear Sir & Brother

I have just been informed that our immediate P. M. of the Lodge is about to leave here in a few minutes for London to see his wife who is alarmingly ill there. I have therefore availed myself of this opportunity to ask you to confer a favor upon me (in the absence of an old friend near you who used to perform the act of Friendship that I am now about to trouble you with, which is to acquaint me if you could procure a Lodging for myself & wife in your street for about a month. We should require either a parlour and Bed room

on a first floor <sup>of two rooms</sup> to have plate and dinner  
with the use of servant to cook & upon you  
obliging me with the terms I will again  
trouble you with a reply stating the time we  
shall take possession

again requesting you will

and pay many months ago?
