DEAR SIR AND BROTHER,

You have no doubt received a summons for yourself, your Wardens and Past Masters, to a Special Grand Lodge, to be held next Friday, the 29th instant, to consider the Report of the Board of General Purposes on the Amendments to the proposed Revision of the Book of Constitutions.

I beg to suggest that you should interest yourself in securing as large a representation of the Members of your Lodge as possible on this occasion. It may be useful to remember that at the Grand Lodge, held in December last, the motion to double the quarterage at present paid by Country Lodges was defeated by a majority of 4 only; it behoves, therefore, those interested to take steps to secure the rejection of this proposition, which is again brought forward, as well as to bring as much support as possible to carry those amendments proposed by this Provincial Grand Lodge, which have not been recommended for adoption.

Enclosed I beg to hand you a copy of the amendments which have been suggested by Provincial Grand Lodge, to which your support is requested.

I also send you some copies of this circular, which you might wish to forward to those Members of your Lodge who are qualified to attend Grand Lodge.
