DEAR SIR AND BROTHER,

I have much pleasure in informing you that I have consented to save as Steward for the above Festival, and most earnestly beg to solicit your support and active in vest. The result of revious Festivals has been the means of providing for the relief of Mark Master Masons in distress, and for the assistance of their Widows and Children, The numerous grants already made by the General Poard and by Grand Todge have in every case been highly appreciated, and have been of such material service to the recipients, as to affect the best possible justification for the establishment of the Fund, and the annual appeal for continued support.

The Fund is divided into three branches, Ber evol. ", Education 1, and Annuity, and all contributions received are equally apportioned to these most deserving objects."

The Benevolent Branch for relief and be, wolence is under a control of the General Board, and the grants above certain amounts have to receive confirmation by Grand Large. Nearly £4,000 has been voted in grants of relief since the formation of this Fund.

The Educational Branch has a souject the aducation of the children of Mark Master Masons eligible for assistance, at Grammar or other School a the vicin ty of the parents' residences.

Twelve Boys and Three Girls e now being a lucated by annual grants from this Fund, and by a vote of Grand Lodge on 30th November, 1886, each child soll receive annually the sum of £5 to procure necessary clothing.

The Annuity Fund was stablished by vote. Grand Lodge on 1st December, 1885, when the amount of £1,000 was voted as a nucleus, and 's object is to grant Annuities of £26 each to aged and decayed Mark Master Masons, and £21 to the Widows of Mark Master Masons, and fter election by the subscribers. There are now Nine Aged Brethren and Five Widows who not cally receive the annual, but also a sum of £5 at Christmas in each year.

A copy of the rule, for the read administration of the Educational and Annuity Funds, with the several qualifications and voting priving ges accruing from Donations and Subscriptions thereto, is annexed, to which your attention is sperially directed

These in portant extersions of the objects for which the "Mark Benevolent Fund" was originally constituted, have been rendered practicable by the kind support extended by Members of the Order since its establishment in 1869, and it is hoped will provide an additional accement to the old Contributors to the Fund to continue their support, and to many others to render essistance, who have hitherto withheld their aid.
