Festival Stewardship.

Every Brother accepting the office of Steward is called upon to pay a fee (settled by the Stewards themselves), usually £2 2s, to "The Stewarte Fund," separate from the Benevolent Fund, and for which he receives his Dinner Ticket, Steward's Badge, &c.; the balance being applied to the necessive expenses the Festival, such as Music, Printing, Postage, &c.
