

Centenary of the Vernon Chapter 1852—1952

Founders: E. Comps. Thomas James, John Burton, William James, Bassett Smith, Fred En., 250 1, William Totty, Thos. Stevenson, Richard P. Tallis and Frank James.

The first meeting, convened by circular, was held on 1st April, 1850, at the residence of Comp. Thomas James. It was resolved that a Royal Arch Chapter be attached to the Lodge of St. Matthew No. 786 (afterwards changed to No. 539 in 1863) and the following companions were nominated to fill the various chairs: Comp. Thomas James, Z., Comp. John Burton, H., Comp. William James, J. It was also resolved that the Chapter should be named "The Vernon Chapter" in honour of the first Grand Superintendent, Most Excellent Companion H. C. Vernon.

The prayer of the Petition having been granted, the first Convocation took place on Friday, 11th June, 1852, at the Lodge Room of the Lodge of St. Matthew, at the New Inn, Park Street, Walsall. In consequence of the illnes of the Prov. Grand Superintendent, M. E. Co. 12 H. C. Vernon, the chapter was Consect ted, by dispensation, by E. Comp. Savage, A. L. Jon, P.Z., of Royal York Chapter No. 7, who also installed the Principals. It is interesting to note that at the same meeting E. Co. 12, John Savage also installed the new Principals of the Peter's Chapter, Wolverha, 20th.

In 1853 the Charter changed its place of meeting to St. Matthe is Hall, situated the rear of the present county Court. In 1858 the Chapter met for the first time at the Dragon, High Street, the lew meeting place of the Lodge of St. Matthe v. All about this time Provincial Grand Chapter was held care a mally in Walsall. In October, 1909, the Chapter met for the first time at the present meeting place in High Street.

on everal years the Chapter experienced any difficulties we to small attendances; on some occasions no curemony was performed and a one meeting in 1867 insufficient Principals attended and the Chapter was not held. In 1876 only the three Principals were present when they found that the Lodge Rooms had been let, by mistake, for another purpose.

Dr. John Burton, one of the founders of the Chapter, died in 1891. He and Comp. E. Newman were responsible for the ritual used to-day by Vernon Chapter. In 1926 a committee was appointed to compare the rituals of E. Comps. Burton and Newman together with the Midland

Working then in use in the Province and an old M.S. book of ritual presented to Or. Burton by E. Comp. Frank James and from him to F Co. p. S. B. Wheway. This old M.S. we have no doubt was the original working. The committee discovered that there was very little a ference in these M.S.S. and the Chapter decided to continue with the working then in use in Vernon Chapter. In 1909 Provinc. I Grand Chapte, had requested the Chapters in the Province o adopt the New Midland Working of that time. After much discussion among the P.2 and correspondence with Frovincial Grand Chapter, approval was even in 1911 by the Prov. Grand Chapter for Vernon to use the 'Parton Newman" ritual for all its ceremo ic. this ritual having been used since its con ecration.

Dut. 1g ".e period 1910 to 1940, E. Comps. Go. 14. Why and Loxton, and M. E. Comp. Rev. Preb A. T. S. Talbot (the late Grand Superintendent of the Province) gave many lectures on arious aspects of the Royal Arch.

In June, 1928, the Patent (dated 2nd May, 1849) appointing Henry Charles Vernon as the first Grand Superintendent of Staffordshire was presented to the Chapter; this interesting document is now carefully preserved. In the minutes of January, 1939, reference is made to the valuable Bible (published in 1599) presented to the Chapter by its first M.E.Z., E. Comp. Thomas James.

In October, 1942, M. E. Comp. Rev. Preb. A. T. S. Talbot, P.G. Std. B., Past Z. of Vernon Chapter, was appointed Grand Superintendent of Staffordshire.

At the meeting in April, 1943, the Grand Superintendent presented an Illuminated Address to E. Comp. S. B. Wheway, P.A.G.D.C., to commemorate the 60th Anniversary of his Exaltation into the Chapter and in April of the following year he also presented a similar Address to E. Comp. C. A. Loxton, P.G. Std. B., on the 60th Anniversary of his Exaltation into the Chapter. Many bound copies of lectures and papers by E. Comp. Loxton have been presented to the Chapter and are available to members for reference and study.
