The Grand Stewards of the Year.

The Grand Stewards of the Year.
 The Master, Past Masters, and Wardens of the Grand Stewards' Lodge, and the Masters, Past Masters, and Wardens of many other Lodges.

The Grand Lodge was opened in ample Form and with solemn Prayer.

The Minutes of the Quarterly Communication of the 4th March, and of the Grand Festival on 29th April last, were severally read and confirmed.

The Minutes of the Lodge of Benevolence of the 25th March, 30th April, and 27th May, were severally read and approved.

A Report from the Board of General Purposes was read, in which they call the Attention of the Grand Lodge to the frequent Neglect of Lodges to the Form of Recommendation attached to the Petition of Applicants to the Lodge of Benevolence for Relief, by Reason of which Neglect the Lodge of Benevolence is not sufficiently informed on the Merit of the Case, and the Applicants are delayed in obtaining Assistance.

Also, to the Neglect of the Masters and Wardens of Lodges in the London District to sign their Names in the Book kept at the Grand Secretary's Office for that Purpose.

It was thereupon RESOLVED—That the Lodges be admonished strictly to attend to the Laws of the Grand Lodge, relative to the Recommendations attached to Petitions of Relief, as the same are set forth in the Book of Constitutions under the Head of Lodge of Benevolence.

RESOLVED,—That the Masters and Wardens of Lodges in the London District do, within One Month after their Appointment to Office, sign their Names in the Book at the Grand Secretary's Office, in Conformity with the Clause 10, page 80, of the Book of Constitutions, which has of late (probably through inadvertence) been much neglected,—as the Grand Lodge will, after this Notice, be compelled to deal with any future Neglect, as a Breach of Masonic Law.

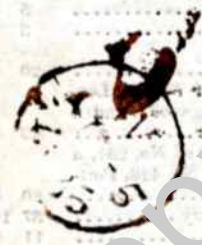
